Down With Webster

Coming to Kirkland Lake June 30th

The Kirkland Lake Festivals Committee is presenting Down With Webster live in concert on June 30 at the Community Complex during this summer's Kirkland Lake Homecoming Week celebrations.

Down With Webster will perform in Kirkland Lake exactly four years to the day of the rap-rock band's first visit, which set the attendance record at the time for a live concert at the arena.

Formed over a decade ago as students, Down With Webster has built a fiercely loyal following on the strength of their party atmosphere live shows and a slew of Top 40 hits in Canada.

Down With Webster has sold 100,000 albums and 800,000 downloads of their hits including: Rich Girl\$, Your Man, Whoa Is Me, She's Dope, Big Wheels, Jessica, One In A Million, Party For Your Life and Chills.

The group consists of 2 MC's: Camm Hunter & Bucky Seja, lead singer Pat Gillett, DJ Diggy Ferris, and a rhythm section featuring drummer Marty Martino and bassist/keyboardist Tyler Armes.

Down With Webster is currently working on new material for their fourth album, which follows: Time To Win Volume 1 (2009), Time To Win Volume 2 (2011) and Party For Your Life (2014), for which they recently received their 6th Juno nomination.

Tyler Shaw will be opening the show. Nominated for the Breakthrough Artist of the Year at the 2014 Juno's, the Coquitlam, BC native's Top 40 hits include: Kiss Goodnight, By My Side, It Happens All The Time and his new single, House of Cards.

In addition, Bellwoods will be a part of the evening's lineup. The Toronto band's infectious debut hit "Live It Up" is currently climbing the Canadian music charts.

Tickets for the all ages concert will be \$40 (tax included) and go on sale at the Complex on March 31st. Online tickets will be available beginning the same day through www.klfestivals.com. The back half of the floor will be licensed for the show.

Down With Webster's June 30th concert will be part of Kirkland Lake's award-winning Homecoming Week, which will also include two Tragically Hip concerts, Canada Day celebrations, an extreme park competition and more.
